### 3.1. COMPETITIONS

#### AFF Suzuki Cup Official Draw Ceremony Virtual 21 September 2021

**A**S a result of the ongoing pandemic, the official draw ceremony for the AFF Suzuki Cup 2020 had to be conducted virtually. It was a first for AFF but it was necessary to ensure the safety and well-being of everyone.

AFF Vice-Presidents, Dato' Sri Francisco Kalbuadi Lay and Mr Lim Kia Tong, conducted the draw ceremony which was closely followed by millions of fans across the region.

AFF President, Major General Khiev Sameth, said: "The safety of everyone involved in the event is our top priority. We will do everything we can, working with all the relevant authorities to ensure the safety of all the participants."

The draw resulted in Vietnam, the reigning champion and winner of AFF Suzuki Cup 2018, being drawn with 2010 champion Malaysia, Indonesia, Cambodia and Laos in Group B.

Group A had five-time champion Thailand and Singapore, winner of the prestigious competition on four occasions, battling along with Myanmar and Philippines. The fifth slot in the group was taken up by the winner of the Qualifying Round between Brunei and Timor Leste.

#### AFF Suzuki Cup 2020 Singapore 5 December 2021 to 1 January 2022

**T**HE rescheduling of the AFF Suzuki Cup 2020 was quickly forgotten once the competition kicked-off in Singapore. Millions of fans, starved of action since the last tournament in 2018, were absolutely thrilled to watch their heroes battling their regional rivals in the hunt for glory and the prestigious title.

Due to the pandemic, AFF made some really tough decisions, among them was having to host the tournament in a centralized format. The previously successful home or away format had to be shelved this time around. The complexity of organising a major event under such trying conditions did not dampen the interest of several MAs who had submitted their proposals to host. After thoroughly evaluating the various proposals, Singapore was eventually chosen for the job.

It was decided that the AFF Suzuki Cup 2020 would be held in a bio-bubble, to protect the safety and health of everyone involved, from the players and officials to the sponsors and volunteers. Those not in the bio-bubble, including media and fans, were also required to abide by the regulations of the Singapore Government which included being fully vaccinated.

Despite the challenges brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic, the untiring efforts and commitment of the AFF, Sportfive, FAS and other MAs ensured that the competition continued unhindered and proceeded as planned. For the fans, they were thrilled and were eager for the competition to kick-off.

#### GROUP A

**W**ITH the presence of five-time champions Thailand looming large, the onus was on the rest of the teams in the group to provide the challenge. Although the Thais had limited time to prepare, they simply packed too much talent and firepower and went onto to top the group, without dropping a single point.

Singapore, a four-time winner of this prestigious competition, had the backing of the home fans which fired them up into delivering their best against the Philippines in a crucial group tie. Victory took the hosts through to the next round.

Myanmar, who spent several weeks in Turkey in preparation for the AFF Suzuki Cup, and Timor Leste, well prepared after participating in the AFC U23 qualifiers, fought bravely but were unable to match their rivals.



#### GROUP B

**D**UE to their participation in the qualifying rounds of the FIFA World Cup 2022, Vietnam was easily among the best-prepared teams in the competition. While they gained massive experience playing some of the continent's leading teams, they were also hit by injuries to several key players.

As was predicted, the battle in the group was always about defending champions Vietnam, Malaysia and Indonesia and which one sail through to the next stage. While Malaysia had several days to prepare prior to their departure, the Indonesian national side were in Turkey for several weeks getting ready to face the fight in Singapore.

After four matches each, it was Indonesia and Vietnam who stole the show and claimed their places in the next stage. Indonesia was in stunning form and emerged the group winner based on the head-to-head results against Vietnam. Cambodia and Laos were looking to pull off some surprises, but it was not to be.

**T**WO quick goals from Thailand were enough to see off defending champions Vietnam. Who else to deliver the killer blow other than Japan-based Chanathip Songkrasin, who scored twice within ten minutes of the first half, first leg.

Vietnam threw everything they had at their opponents in the second leg, alas, it was not enough to overturn the deficit as Thailand booked their place in the final for the ninth time in 13 editions.

Indonesia, on the other hand, lived through the dreaded drama of extra time before defeating host Singapore to confirm their place in the final. The first leg concluded in a draw, but the second-leg tie saw both teams pulling out all the stops as they set their sights on the next round.

Singapore battled furiously and gave it their all, but Indonesia managed to hang to their nerves and walked away 5-3 winners on aggregate.

### FINAL

**T**HAILAND showed just how crucial it is to strike an early goal. The immensely talented Chanathip was on target just two minutes into the first leg final. The goal disrupted Indonesia's rhythm and Thailand pressed on to walk away 4-0 winners and with one hand firmly on the coveted trophy.

The return leg three days later saw Indonesia putting up an improved and confident performance but after storming ahead, and despite their best attempts, they could not build on their lead. Thailand, with a fairly

comfortable lead in the bag, crept back into the game and made the best of their chances.

The game ended with a 2-2 draw and Thailand went on to raise the region's most prized piece of silverware for a record-breaking sixth time in the history of the tournament which was inaugurated in 1996. Thailand had previously lifted the title in 1996, 2000, 2002, 2014 and 2016.

Not surprisingly, Chanathip won the Most Valuable Player Award and was also the joint winner of the Top Goalscorer Award along with Teerasil Dangda (Thailand), Safawi Rasid (Malaysia) and Bienvenido Maranon (Philippines). AFF President Major General Khiev Sameth presented the AFF Suzuki Cup to Chanathip.

## FIFA President Gianni Infantino Attends Opening Ceremony

IT WAS a historic day as FIFA President Gianni Infantino attended Southeast Asia's biggest and most popular football competition. Since the tournament started back in 1996, Infantino is the first-ever FIFA President to grace the event which is followed by millions across the region. It was also the first time that a FIFA President attended a tournament organised by a Regional Association. "The Asean region is the fifth-biggest world economy, and we need to work together to make this competition and Asean football grow, to make it become the top of the world," Mr Infantino said.

Mr Infantino praised the steps taken by the AFF for the development of football's foundations in the region and pledged commitment to sustainable growth of the game in Southeast Asia.

## FIFA Praises AFF and Member Associations for Successful EST Campaign

FIFA President Gianni Infantino, speaking at the opening of the AFF Suzuki Cup, was also full of praises for AFF's Emerging Stronger Together campaign. Mr Infantino thanked key workers for their societal roles in response to Covid-19 and called for continued collaboration to make a stronger future for football by backing AFF's EST campaign.

He also expressed his appreciation and support for AFF's Emerging Stronger Together (EST) campaign. "We have realised in these years that there is something that is more important than football, and that is health," said Mr Infantino.

"We have also realised that in order to get through it [this period], that we need to be together. We recognise the work that has been

done [by key workers], we thank them, and we also need to work for them. Because our responsibility – and that of federations in the Asean region covering a population of 650 million people – is to bring back hope, optimism and joy through football. And this AFF Suzuki Cup is a competition which unites a whole region."

Among other things, the Emerging Stronger Together campaign salutes the determination of all those working to help communities recover including frontliners and honoured the memories of those who passed away.

AFF engaged fans and got them involved in the campaign by introducing several initiatives including but not limited to contests, which led to some lucky fans winning tickets to the final. The campaign was enormously successful as it deepened the appreciation of fans in the region for the hard work of the frontliners and inspired them to do more for the vulnerable in the communities during these challenging times.

One of the most visible activities was the Branding in Stadiums, Broadcast and social media. EST branding, with its clearly defined and attractive logo, stood out prominently and reached hundreds of millions across the region and beyond. It was a remarkable achievement by AFF.

At the end of the AFF Suzuki Cup 2020, every football fan in the region would have seen the EST logo.

Still in the stadiums, the Signs of Appreciation to Frontliners and Tribute of Thanks was another hit as messages from fans to frontliners appeared on the boards, electronic boards. On broadcast, crawlers were displayed during live matches.

At stadiums, AFF acknowledged the supreme efforts of the frontliners in the Tribute of Thanks by inviting them for matches, they were noticeable in groups and enjoyed themselves watching matches.

Prior to the start of the tournament, players were requested to try hold their Celebration Antics after scoring in front of the EST a-boards, giving even wider prominence to the EST campaign. This worked out wonderfully thanks to the support of the players.

Speaking of the players, they were also actively supportive of other EST initiatives including the One-Minute Silence, Players Pledge and Captain Armband activities. For the Players Pledge, the captains of teams were recorded reading out the EST Players Pledge and the videos shared with their fans.

For the fans, AFF organised Tribute to Frontliners, EST T-Shirt Design and EST Fans Stories contests, all of which received excellent responses from Southeast Asian fans. Winners of the Fans Stories contests won all-paid expenses trips to Singapore for the final.

The Let's Go White activity was an opportunity for fans to show their support for the frontliners by turning up at the stadium in white coloured outfits. The frontliners will realise by watching these fans at the stadiums or on TV that it is a message of appreciation for their enormous sacrifices and dedication.

Mr Infantino's praise and support of the EST campaign is recognition of the tremendous efforts of the AFF and the Member Associations who all contributed to the overall success of the campaign. The combined commitment of the MAs to the campaign ensured the EST message was shared with millions of fans in the region.









**AFF Futsal Cup 2021**

THE seventh edition of the AFF Futsal Club Championship, was organised for the second time in a leading shopping mall in Korat known as Terminal 21. The FA of Thailand's experience in handling futsal events, including the Futsal World Cup in 2012, ensured a well-organised AFF Futsal Cup.

After five days of competition, Freefire Bluewave Chonburi and Port FC were tied at nine points each going into the final match of the tournament. The match ended in a 3-3 draw with Freefire Bluewave Chonburi crowned the AFF Futsal Club champions on a superior goal difference.

## 3.2. COURSES/SEMINARS/WEBINARS

### Asean Football Federation (AFF) and Qatar Football Association's (QFA) Digital Learning Series 2nd Edition Virtual Webinar 23 - 25 February 2021

THE Asean Football Federation (AFF) in collaboration with Qatar Football Association (QFA) and Josoor Institute, started its calendar of activities with the organisation of the second instalment of the four Digital Learning Series webinars titled Football Integrity, Event Safety and Security and Organising International Football Tournaments in Light of the COVID-19 Pandemic.

The objective of the webinar was for participants to gain insight from prominent figures in international sport business including executives who had been and were still leading clubs, leagues, federations, authorities as well as agencies.
